

Barstow Community College Presidential Goals 2012-2013

- I. The president will oversee efforts to complete an accreditation follow-up report and position the college for a satisfactory accreditation team follow-up visit.
- II. The president will actively encourage the development of college programs designed to increase student success, such as basic skills, remediation, outreach, engagement, retention, and partnerships with K-12 districts, and strive to inculcate in student services units a passion for "customer service."
- III. The president, in conjunction with the vice president of administrative services, will move forward impending construction projects and seek out ways to provide district funding for future projects, such as a general obligation bond campaign.
- IV. The president will promote and support efforts at developing and expanding career and technical education programs intended to enhance student success and meet the workforce and economic needs of the greater Barstow region.
- V. The president will continue to support college efforts to use data contained in the Educational Master Plan, Strategic Plan, Technology Plan, Facilities Plan, Program Review, ARCC Reports, Fact Book, and other sources for analyzing student success and institutional effectiveness/efficiency, and using the evidence and analysis to justify funding for the institution's highest priorities and stated goals.
- VI. The president will effectively oversee the college's finances at a time of statewide budgetary constraint, maintain a budget reserve of approximately 15%, engage in cost containment and effective enrollment management, as well as seek ways of enhancing institutional revenues.
