

One of the most impactful contributions by Dr. Banton and her team is the creation of *The Mindful Space*, a safe and inclusive environment on campus designed to support students' mental health and well-being.

Supporting Veterans into Skilled Trades: VEEP Program

The Veterans Electrical Entry Program (VEEP) pre-apprenticeship is a national electrical training ALLIANCE program offered at local training centers around the United States. These programs create local collaborative efforts between the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW), local community colleges, and the U.S. military to give participants a direct pathway into union apprenticeship programs.

VEEP was developed to provide transitioning service members and recently separated veterans the ability to re-enter the civilian workforce in a high demand field. By completing the VEEP pre-apprenticeship, a qualifying participant gains direct entry into an electrical apprenticeship at a location of their choosing. During the VEEP pre-apprenticeship students will be exposed to most, if not all, of the first-year curriculum for their given apprenticeship. In addition, those enrolled as part of an in-person cohort will also receive hands-on training. Local programs are currently offered through a


